Pejman: Great, thank you so much.

Receptionist: My pleasure. Have a nice day.

B USE 1: Now



Use the *Present Continuous* to express the idea that something is happening now.

Sometimes, speakers use the *Present Continuous* to indicate that something will happen in the near future.

Possessive

A When we want to show that something belongs to somebody, we usually add an apostrophe + s ('s) to a singular noun and an apostrophe (') to a plural noun, for example:

- the boy's ball (one boy)
- the boys' ball (two or more boys)
- Sue and Mary's parents

Irregular Plurals

Some nouns have irregular plural forms without **s** (man → men). To show possession, we usually add **'s** to the plural form of these nouns:

singular noun	plural noun
my child's dog	my children's dog
the man's work	the men's work
the mouse's cage	the mice's cage
a person's clothes	people's clothes

- the door **of** the car
 - the leg **of** the table.
